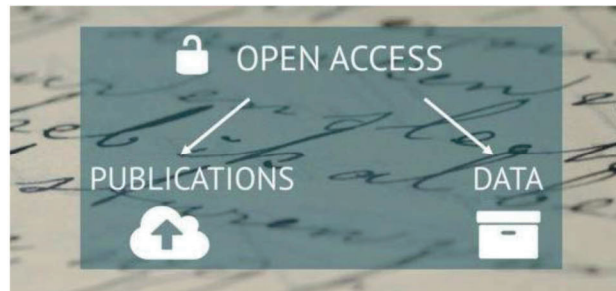


As coordinator you have to:

- ✓ Disseminate the results compulsory
- ✓ Make EU funding visible GA obligation
- ✓ Include EU emblem GA obligation
- ✓ Add disclaimer
- ✓ All not respected could lead to grant reduction

OPEN ACCESS (OA)

Free of charge & re-usable on-line access to scientific information



As open as possible, as closed as necessary



Open Access is defined as the practice of providing on-line access to scientific information that is *free of charge* to the user and is *re-usable*

For Research and Innovation, **open access to scientific information** implies only two categories:

- o **Peer-reviewed scientific publications** (primarily research articles published in academic journals)
- o **Scientific research data**: data underlying publications and/or other data such as unpublished datasets or raw data

It goes without saying, that participants may opt out of making information/results openly available if there are legitimate reasons; such as for *commercial, confidentiality, privacy or security requirements*, prior to filing a patent, etc.

As open as possible, as closed as necessary: closed data in the following cases

- If the project will not generate / collect any data
- Conflict with obligation to protect results
- Conflict with confidentiality obligations
- Conflict with security obligations
- Conflict with rules on protection of personal data
- If the achievement of the action's main objective would be jeopardised

OA TO PUBLICATIONS

- OA for **peer-reviewed scientific publications** about project results (Art 29.2)
- Embargo period accepted

Details **Open Access general obligations**

GA 29.2: Full mandate on OA to peer-reviewed publications

- Obligation to all beneficiaries, either through the Green or Gold (deposition mandatory either way)
- Allowed embargoes: 6/12m
- Gold open access costs eligible
- Authors encouraged to retain copyright and grant licences to publishers
- Peer-reviewed journal articles: strong mandate (no exceptions)
- H2020 Online manual: Proceedings, books, monographs, etc.: strong encouragement

Green OA

- No publishing fees
- Deposit a copy in a repository: immediately after publication
- Open Access: latest 6 months after publication (12 for SSH)
- Some journals have longer embargoes -> non-compliant (check SHERPA/RoMEO or journal website)

Gold OA

- Publishing fees: from 0 EUR to several thousand
- Deposit a copy in a repository: immediately after publication
- Open Access: immediately after publication
- Some journals accept both options (hybrid)
